Busyness Help

As many of you know, the fall season is my busy season each year. Between my wife's volleyball team at Mayfield, my daughter's volleyball team at West Geauga, and then coaching my son and daughter's soccer team at the same time, life is extremely busy. But I wouldn't trade it in for anything. I enjoy enjoying life and watching my family enjoy life also. So many times, we allow our schedule to dictate our life so much that we start to feel helpless in life. And, it's interesting the number of expressions we've invented to describe those helpless feelings when we are not sure what to do or how to respond. We say things like, *I'm in a pinch* or *my life is too jammed packed to do anything*. And, instead of slowing down and/or relying on God to help us through our busy season, we try to do everything we can under our own power. What's more interesting is that Christians even believe that the phrase *God helps those who help themselves* is in the Bible. This phrase gets quoted like it's coming directly from Proverbs. The fact is, this expression is nowhere in the Bible. Additionally, it doesn't even reflect the nature of God. Think about it, as long as we are helping ourselves, who needs God?

Actually, the exact opposite is true that God helps the helpless! Often, it's when we are at the end of our rope and cry out to God that He can help us best. When we feel the most helpless is when God often steps in and says, *Cast all your cares upon Me, for I care for you* (see **1 Peter 5:7**). There is no doubt that relying on God sometimes goes against our human nature, but it does invite divine intervention. If you are currently in a *back against the wall* kind of predicament, grab your Bible and soak in the greatest advice from the greatest power source ever. Find a **Scripture** verse you want to read, **observe** what it is telling you, think of ways to **apply** it and then **pray** that God will help you implement it today. If you want the word of Christ to dwell in you (see **Colossians 3:16**), you have to get the word in you! And, once it is in you, it can change you and give you the power you need for life and power to conquer any helpless feeling. As I close, reflect on the power that David so beautifully defines in **Psalms 23**. God is the one who will **provide** for us, **restore** us, **protect** us, **comfort** us and even **anoint** us. You are never helpless with God in your corner. The next time you feel helpless, help yourself to His word and let it give you the power you need for today!

May you never get too busy that you forget to get in your Bible!

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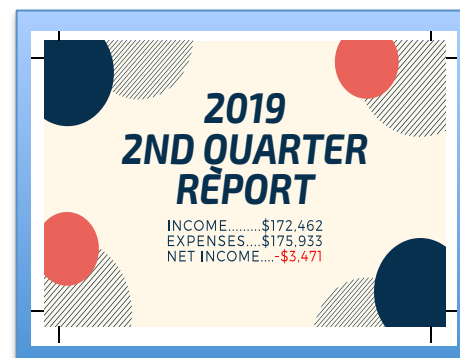

I'll never forget the day I was healed and given a new lease on my life. In April of 2015 I was having the worst headaches of my life. I thought after months of pain and several blackouts I needed to go see a doctor. I went to the Cleveland Clinic, then I went to UH to get a second opinion, then finally I went to the one person that had taken care of my family for years and the only doctor I could truly trust. They all

said the same thing. Jim... you have Stage IV brain cancer called Glioblastoma. I was in shock. How could this be? My whole life has been full of disappointment after disappointment and now I have CANCER... I was mad, angry, and furious with everything and everyone! Most of all I blamed God. I thought, wow... my whole life I was told to be good, do good, and yet I was physically beaten almost every night. My family treated me like garbage. My family doctor told me to get my affairs in order. It's amazing how many things you think about when you know your time is up. Your whole life flashes before you. I wish I could go back and do THIS over. I wish I had done THAT. Why didn't I make TIME for that? But Now I am watching my daughter take care of me from the side effects of chemo and radiation, which I said I would never do. I was giving in to cancer. I used to think I was superman, I am strong, I am honest, and I want truth and justice in this world. Instead I'm weak, sick, tired and giving up.

Fast forward....It is now June 2016. My friend, whom I was training in my Martial Arts dojo during the time I was going through chemo and radiation, is a priest at a church in Chesterland. He said to me, "Jim... I have not given up on you. Please come to my church and pray. I have the statue of the Virgin Mary that travels the world at my church this week. Maybe you can come in and just sit and pray." I grew up with grandparents that believed. They took me to a catholic church every Sunday but I really didn't believe in God because my life was so bad. But he was very compelling and to be honest I had nothing to lose. I figured... ok, I have been blaming God my whole life. I had so many questions that needed answers I'm going to go get them. So I took my daughter and we went to his church. I walked in and he told me to go sit down, take your time, and pray. He told me he would stop anybody from coming in until I was done. My daughter sat behind me and I went to the altar to kneel down, not really thinking this would make any difference. I started to pray and then I just stood up and yelled, "WHY ARE YOU DOING THIS TO ME!?! WHY HAVE YOU PUT ME THROUGH SO MUCH PAIN AND NOW THIS...WHY WHY WHY!?" A calm and very peaceful voice said to me, "**Calm my son. Sit and let's talk.**" I looked around for Fr. Chuck, but nobody was in the room but my daughter and me. I thought... ok I have finally lost it. I'm now crazy! I actually asked out loud, "Who is talking to me? Who are you?" The voice said to me, "**You have spent many years blaming me and telling me how I feel. You have said many times that I am to blame for your awful life.**" I was in shock! For the first time I really felt afraid. I asked my daughter if she could hear the voice and she said no dad I just hear you. I thought to myself, ok this is it. I'm going to get the answers to my life. And no matter what I'm not leaving here until I get the truth. So, I asked, "If you are truly God why didn't you ever help me in my life? Why did you let so many bad things happen to me?" He said to me, "**Why do you think it was me? Why do you think I want to hurt you? I love you! You are my son! Who put your grandparents in your life when you felt alone? Who held you when you cried? Who made you feel strong when you wanted to give up...?**" I asked, "Why!?! Why weren't you there? Why didn't you talk to me? Why did you let it all happen?" He said, "**I was there. I asked you to let me help you. You screamed at me and told me you are stronger and you can take it. I asked you to give me your problems and I'll take them from you, but you pushed me away. I never left you! The more you pushed, the more I tried to help you.**" I said to him, "Well it doesn't matter now. I'm dying! I will never get to feel and experience true love. I will never get to say all the things I wanted to say. I will never get to do all the things I wanted to do. What good is any of it now anyway? It's all over!!!" I fell to my knees and begged for more time. I begged for my life. I said I'm sorry! Please let me feel love! Fill my heart with love and life! I want to do what I was meant to do. I want the Holy Spirit in me so I can feel the true love of God in my body. Clean me of all the nasty, angry, hurtful demons in my body. Help me to forgive and let go of my past. Give me a chance to show what I can do. Let me show that I can really help people. The Lord said to me, "**Why do you think I'm here? It's time to let me help you because I have so many plans for you, so many things I'm waiting for you to do.**" I told him if he gave me the time, I wouldn't waste it. I would say and do the things I have promised in the past and never done. He asked me if I believed in him. I answered, "Yes Lord I do! I believe you are the God who died for me and forgave me for all my sins". He told me if he gave me this 2nd chance I needed to just do what he says. Don't ask why. Just do it. If I could agree to this he would give me a 2nd chance to do what was right. He would give me my heart's desire, but I needed to keep my promises to Him this time. I told him I would do anything he wanted me to do. He told me to go in peace and feel his love and the gift of the Holy Spirit.

There were so many things I wanted to do when I left there. But one of the first things I wanted was to tell my best friend, currently my wife, how much I loved her and that I have loved her since jr. high school. I wanted to tell her that God healed me and is giving me a 2nd chance at life. The second thing I wanted was to tell the world what I now believe, that I have been saved! When I left the church that night Fr. Chuck never asked me what had happened. All he said was I hope you got your answers. I told him I got much more than that. I felt so strong and full of life that night. Two weeks later I went to see my family Dr. He told me he wanted to do a few more test. He told me I seemed to be doing better than expected. I should have been in pain and not able to do all the things I was doing. When the test results came back my cancer was down from 36mm to 16mm. My cancer was shrinking...

I had other health issues I was dealing with as well during my cancer treatments. My heart and lungs were in bad shape from inhaling cigars for 26yrs. I had test taken and retaken which resulted in "unexplained" events that the medical professionals couldn't explain how blockages, spots on my lungs etc... all disappeared with no medical explanations. They were now all gone! No surgeries, no medicine. NOTHING! Even when I went to my neurologist and he took a new scan of my brain. He told me that I have had a miracle! My cancer was GONE! Out of all my doctors that treated me he was the only Dr. to acknowledge I had a healing from God.

I had truly received a gift from God!

It's amazing how my life is now! I'm thankful for everything I have because I know my Father Loves Me. I have gone from angry, blaming, hurtful, daily sinner to a better man, a thankful man, a BELIEVING MAN.

Thank You Lord for my gift! Thank You for Your love! Thank You that Your Spirit is in my heart. Thank you for my kids, my wife (who makes me a better man), my mom (who has been more of a real mom to me than my blood mom) and my friends! Thank You for my home that is filled with Your Spirit. Thank You that Your Spirit is at my church, Chester Christian Center, which is my home!

Across our nation, public education for multiplied millions of students has already begun for the 2019-2020 school year, and for others it will begin soon. The launch of a new school year is a major event and is approached with varying degrees of excitement and anticipation, along with concerns and fears. As we move into a new academic year, please consider including the following areas of focus in your times of prayer:

1. God's blessings upon all students, teachers, administrators, and staff throughout the academic year.

Public education is a huge team effort. Students are served not only by their principals and teachers, but by a host of other staff that care for a variety of responsibilities day after day. Pray for a covering of God's blessings over the students who are close to your heart and over the student body in general. Consider praying regularly over a directory of names of people who serve the school in your area or district. Pray that God will give them wisdom and guidance as they fulfill their various responsibilities.

2. Attitude of gratefulness among parents and guardians for the investment teachers make in their children's lives.

Teaching can be a thankless job. Expectations and demands are high, yet expressions of gratitude, appreciation, and encouragement often are few. Take time regularly to thank God for the teachers who serve students each week. Many of them not only invest time well beyond the classroom, but also give of their own resources to enhance the teaching-learning experience in their classrooms. As opportunity warrants, personally express thanks for their efforts and pray that others will do the same. Words of encouragement and promises to pray can mean a lot.



3. Students who have moved to new communities, that they will adjust quickly to unfamiliar surroundings and form meaningful and healthy friendships.

Many students will have recently moved to new communities. This transition can add significant stress to the already huge challenge of a new school year. A key issue to adjusting is finding someone to connect with as a friend. Pray that positive, healthy friendships will be quickly established. Encourage students in your family or other spheres of influence to be sensitive to new students that are looking for a friend in their schools.

4. Positive and enriching learning experiences for students of all ages.

Although a period of "compulsory" (mandated, required) education has been established by law, learning also is intended to be compelling and life-shaping. Pray that students will be vitally engaged in the learning process through creative and relevant instruction. Pray also that distractions that abound in our culture will be minimized, allowing the students to focus on and apply the information shared in the classroom.

5. Impact of Christ-following students and adults alike who understand that they are sent to make a difference for Jesus Christ in their schools.

Christ-following students and adults are not on school campuses by happenstance. Schools are strategic mission fields providing numerous opportunities for life-changing divine appointments. Pray that godly students and adults will be sensitive to moments when they can redemptively influence students or colleagues through their conversations and example. Pray also for favor with school administrators in seeking ways to provide extra-curricular activities that can minister to students.

6. Teachers who are standing before a class for the first time, that they will have confidence in their skills and establish strong connections with their students.

In many public schools this year, first-time teachers are beginning their inaugural journeys in the classroom. While much preparation has preceded this moment, the first days and weeks can be daunting. Pray that new teachers will be infused with confidence and gain respect and appreciation from their students through their teaching excellence and character. If you know of new teachers, seek them out and assure them of your prayers.

7. Comfort and assurance for parents sending their children to the school for the first time.

For many parents, seeing a child off to school for the first time can be a very emotional experience. They are releasing their child into the hands of others with whom they are not personally acquainted. There are many unknowns. Will my child adjust? Will he or she find a friend? Will learning be enjoyable? Will my child be safe? Pray that parents will be surrounded by God's peace and comfort and that their child will quickly adjust to this new experience for them as well. Come alongside someone you know whose child has just begun school and offer encouragement and prayer.

8. God's care and protection throughout the school year.

Tragic events of recent years have raised great concerns in the hearts and minds of many parents and children alike. Pray for a covering of God's protection over the schools in your area and across the nation. Pray for vigilance among administrators and teachers as well as security personnel. Pray that would-be perpetrators will be turned from their intentions and receive the corrective influences that are needed in their lives. Take time to do prayer walks or drive around the school property, asking God's care and protection. Pray that the school year will be successfully completed without incident. As you pray and intercede, give thanks to God for the wonderful privilege that our children have to attend school and learn. May we never take that for granted.

PRECIOUS IN HIS EYES Foster Care Ministry

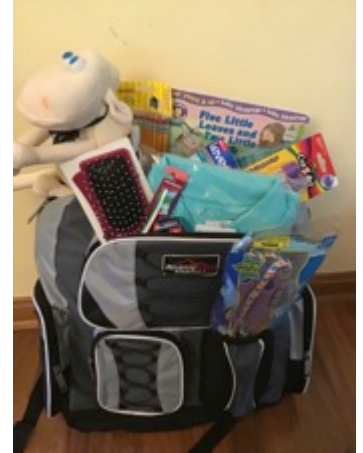
Did you know that in Geauga County there are 60 to 70 children in the foster care system? Unfortunately, the numbers are rising, and so are the needs. Foster parents are desperately needed. Only about half of these children will be taken into foster homes. The others will have to live in group home environments. Some will eventually be adopted, some will be reunited with their own families, and some will age out of the group homes. Many of these children will go from place to place with no permanent home.

"Pure and undefiled religion before God and the Father is this: To visit orphans and widows in their trouble, and to keep oneself unspotted from the world" James 1:27.

Not all Christians are called to be foster parents, but we can all do something. When a child goes into foster care, they usually come with nothing but the clothes they are wearing, or maybe a few items carried in a garbage bag. In June, the Women of Purpose ladies put together 20 placement diaper and book bags. Each child going into custody will receive an age appropriate bag filled with a blanket and stuffed animal, hygiene items, clothing, books, diapers/underwear, socks, toys, bottles, etc. The bags were then delivered to Geauga County Jobs and Family Services. This was a huge blessing for the social workers. They had never received anything like this. Now a child going into custody will have something of their own. I asked if there was anything else they needed. They told me that they reward good behavior by taking a child out to a fast food restaurant for lunch. This has been a good motivator for them. Unfortunately, the money for this comes out of their own pockets. They asked for donations of fast food gift cards. They can be from McDonald's, Chick-fil-A, Chipotle, Taco Bell, Burger King, Arby's or Subway.

If you feel led to donate, please drop gift cards in the offering plate on Sunday, September 28th.

And above all, please pray for these precious children, the foster families and the social workers. Let us spread the love of God to our most vulnerable, and in the process, glorify our Father in heaven.

Gordon & Sue Wright ***Sunday September 15th at 10:30am***

Gordon is founder and executive director of [Jesus Inn Ministries, Inc.](#) and an elder at [Tulsa Christian Fellowship](#), a New Testament church located in the city of Tulsa. He is the father of seven children ranging in age from 34 to 17 years old. His wife, Sue, is actively engaged in the discipling of young women as well as homeschooling the youngest of the seven children. In the late 1980's as the wall came down in Berlin and the Soviet Union started to disintegrate Gordon took an exploratory trip into Russia by train via Helsinki, Finland. Out of that trip and further ones that followed the ministry of [East/West Resources International](#) was born.

Gordon is also founder and president of [East/West Resources International](#), a networking organization working to develop ministry and partnerships in 2nd and 3rd world countries to facilitate the training and equipping of pastors and church leadership. In this capacity Gordon is also director of the [Sister Church Project \(SCP\)](#) which links American churches with Russian and Ukrainian churches for spiritual and material support. The [Sister Church Project](#) has been in existence for over 16 years and at present supports 13 pastors, 7 in Ukraine and 6 in Russia.

In addition to his immediate responsibilities Gordon also serves on the executive committee of the international board of [Shelter For Life](#), a humanitarian aid organization committed to rebuilding infrastructure in countries effected by conflict or natural disaster; Iraq, Afghanistan, Pakistan, etc. He also travels on behalf of Shelter For Life as a member care pastor.

Gordon also serves as vice president on the international board of [Global Assistance Partners \(GAP\)](#). GAP conducts Bible Institutes and continuing education for pastors and church workers in both Ukraine and Kenya, East Africa. In Kenya GAP also ministers to the physical needs of AIDs orphans and widows. Gordon's responsibility with GAP includes teaching in each of the Bible Institutes either annually or biannually.

Gordon has written numerous articles and teaching pamphlets. Pamphlets and bookmark teachings include such topics and titles as: *Hearing God's Voice*, *The Martha/Mary Syndrome*, *Ye Have Need of Endurance*, *Korah's Rebellion*, *A Faithful Man* and *Pray for your Leaders*. He has also completed a 16-tape discipleship teaching series on *Foundations for Christian Growth* available on both audio and videocassette.

Gordon has become known as a gifted prophetic teacher and has traveled and ministered throughout various portions of the United States and 30 countries abroad, including: Russia, Ukraine, Germany, Romania, Poland, Bulgaria, Finland, Sweden, Iraq, Afghanistan, India, Pakistan, Cambodia, Bangladesh, Kenya, Japan and the city-state of Singapore. He has been used of the Lord nationally as well as internationally in the founding of new works as well as exhorting and encouraging leadership and existing local fellowships.
